1.	<p>Uncurrent Check Listings. Records relating to the accounting for checks issued by the Treasury Department from 1849 to 1956 (no longer accumulating). Checks were all issued prior to the current check processing and reconciliation system presently in operation. The information is contained in ledger form, and is filed by fiscal year of date issued, then alpha by Disbursing Officer.</p> <p>Ledgers - 1849 thru 1931. To be maintained in action office.</p> <p>Ledgers - 1932 thru 1956. Transfer to the Federal Records Center.</p> <p>DISPOSITION NOT AUTHORIZED AT THIS TIME. Currently, the provisions of 31 USC 132 effectively prohibit the destruction of the records described. Although this series does not have enduring historical value, a finite retention can not be established until the law has been changed. Since all recent efforts to modify the law have failed, the Bureau anticipates a substantial delay in scheduling these records for final disposition. This item will be resubmitted to NARS for approval when 31 USC 132 is amended.</p>		WITHDRAWN
