The Commission was established by Congress to study and make recommendations on a variety of issues including; federal law enforcement priorities for the 21st century, the degree of coordination among federal law enforcement agencies, and the necessity for the present number of federal law enforcement agencies and units. The Commission report is to be submitted to the Congress. The Commission will Terminate on October 30, 1999.</p> <p><i>*The Commission terminated Feb. 29, 2000.</i></p>
