The Civil War Sites Advisory Commission, which was established by Public Law 101-628 in 1990, was mandated to prepare a study of historically significant Civil War sites in the United States. The Commission was specifically charged with identifying Civil War sites, determining the relative significance of such sites, assessing short- and long-term threats to their integrity, proposing alternatives for the preservation and interpretation of such sites, and researching and proposing innovative open space and land use preservation techniques.

The Commission was comprised of fifteen members, two designated by law, four appointed by the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, four appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the United States Senate, and five appointed by the Secretary of Interior. The Commission held sixteen public meetings nation-wide to solicit comment on battlefield preservation. In addition, the Commission sponsored five preservation workshops to discuss preservation alternatives with nationally-recognized experts in various fields including heritage tourism and education, historic preservation, land use and tax laws, local land use planning, and farmland preservation.

The Commission, through its staff historians and volunteers, conducted field studies, historic research, and consulted with experts to identify and evaluate 384 principal Civil War battle sites in 25 states. Each site was documented in the field and evaluated in terms of its importance to the Civil War and its various campaigns. The 384 principal sites were prioritized based on military significance, integrity, threats, and the amount of land currently preserved at each site. Field data and field maps for sites in and near urban areas were digitized and further studied through computer mapping and Geographical Information Systems (GIS).

The Commission has used their findings to develop a series of recommendations to the United States Congress and the Secretary of Interior in a report and action agenda released July 12, 1993. It is expected that these recommendations will form the basis for legislative proposals in the area of battlefield preservation.
