Dear Mr. Eggleston:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open Clinton Presidential records in response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests listed in Attachment A.

These records, consisting of 153,589 pages, have been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 28,218 pages restricted in whole and three pages restricted in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 125,638 pages in whole and three pages in part. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President Clinton's representative, Bruce Lindsey, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is September 16, 2015, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

Much of this correspondence expressed significant concern about the business and economic ramifications if the work stoppage was not ended soon. A significant volume of these letters also demanded that the Taft-Hartley Act be invoked and UPS be put back to work.

The correspondence contains material from the Department of Education regarding state and local responsibilities on gun safety laws, H.R. 3 "Taking Back Our Streets Act of 1995", teen drug use, and material on other cases citing the United States v. Lopez case. The memoranda and reports contain analysis, recommendations, and proposals regarding the case and Uniform Crime Reports 1995 Preliminary Report. The statements relate to the Senate Subcommittee on Youth Violence "Guns in Schools: A Federal Rule" hearings. There are also materials on the Anti-Gang and Youth Violence Control Act of 1996 and charts on adult and juvenile murder arrest rates 1980-1995.

Other documents relate to international cooperation, missile defense, national security, organ transplantation, research and development, satellite systems, statutes, technology, telecommunications, and tobacco.

The correspondence also relates to the treatment of ethnic Greek minorities in Albania, the Albanian parliamentary elections, the emigration laws and policies of Albania, Berisha's constitution regarding religious matters, the tensions and fighting in Albania and Kosovo, the brutal murder of at least 45 Albanians in Racak, Kosovo, and the humanitarian efforts regarding the refugee crisis and camps in Albania and Hungary. There are reports from US

Representative Frank Wolf of Virginia regarding his visits to Albania and the Balkans, and an international cable with Independence Day greetings to President Clinton. There are also materials regarding correspondence and meetings with President Berisha.

These surveys interpreted the data in an extensive fashion and were produced on a regular basis.

Lampreia met with numerous Clinton officials during his trips, including Secretaries of State Warren Christopher and Madeleine Albright, US Trade Representatives Mickey Kantor and Charlene Barshefsky, Commerce Secretary Bill Daley, Assistant Secretary of State Jeffrey Davidow, Special Envoy for the Americas Kenneth MacKay, Anthony Lake, and Samuel Berger. The topics covered include international trade relations and meeting logistics. The records consist of articles, background and briefing papers, talking points, handwritten meeting notes, charts, press releases, press briefings, draft schedules, transmittal and cover sheets, memoranda, emails, and cables.

meetings on the conflict. The NSC Records Management file contains correspondence of a general nature from Congressman Frank Wolf regarding the appointment of the U.S. Special Negotiator on Nagorno-Karabakh.

Topics covered in the binders include economics, US/regional national security, human rights, labor and environment, the World Trade Organization, industry and agriculture, and small business issues.

These records describe the 1996 Farm Bill, the Agricultural Market Transition Act (AMTA), USDA’s announcements of prevailing world market prices for cotton and rice and the resulting marketing loan gains and loan deficiency payment rates available to producers. Other documents are agricultural reports on markets and perspectives, remarks by Secretary of Agriculture Dan Glickman on agricultural assistance programs, proposed USDA Marketing Loan changes, Economic Injury Disaster Loans for drought victims, the federal response to the 1999 drought and heat wave, FY 2000 Agriculture appropriations conference report to including \$5.5 billion to double Freedom to Farm or Agricultural Market Transition Act payments and \$1.2 billion in disaster aid, and H.R. 3194, the Consolidated Appropriations Act for FY 2000.

The subject matter includes initial reaction to the shooting and the administration’s first responses, both in policy and strategy; dozens of recommended phone calls to victims’ families and local government officials; and speech texts by President Clinton, Mrs. Clinton, Vice President Gore, Education Secretary Richard Riley, and Attorney General Janet Reno. Reaction to the massacre also resulted in a higher emphasis on dealing with the issues of school violence and weapons legislation to include several high-profile conferences on youth violence. Follow-up material includes coordinating speeches and travel for the anniversary of the school shooting, as well as responses to letters from Columbine victims and those personally affected by the tragedy. Files include discussion of a “Columbine Fund,” which was requested by victims’ attorneys almost a year after the fact. The NSC Records Management numbered documents consist of condolence letters from foreign government officials to President Clinton and the American people immediately following the massacre.

This material, consisting of 153,589 pages, has been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 28,218 pages restricted in whole and three pages restricted in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 125,368 pages in whole and three pages in part. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing the incumbent President of our intent to release these Clinton Presidential records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is September 16, 2015, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

correspondence, memoranda, magazine and newspaper articles, legal journal articles, press releases, resumes, and LexisNexis materials focusing on the judicial opinions by Cabranes. There is a significant amount of material related to Cabranes' legal career publications. Non-selection material has been closed for b(6).

A daily email was sent out with a list of who wrote the White House and on which topic. White House staffers would often reply to the daily email to request that a particular letter be faxed to them. The majority of the records cover 1998-2000. There is little discussion concerning the actual responses to the members of Congress, rather the staff members are more concerned about making sure the right letter is seen by the right staffer who could then appropriately respond to the member of Congress' concerns. There are no letters from the members of Congress in the email, only a list of what was received.

Subject Files responsive to this FOIA primarily consist of letters, memoranda, and speech remarks. Letters regard Trumka's involvement with the UMWA and the coal industry in 1994 and also the UMWA's 51st Constitutional Convention in 1995. Letters of recommendation are also responsive. Memoranda concern President Clinton's meeting with AFL-CIO leaders, including Trumka, in 1995. President Clinton's speech remarks concern a UMWA dinner honoring Trumka in 1996 and the AFL-CIO Convention in 1997. Staff and Office Files include lists and memoranda. These guest lists, which include Trumka, concern the White House Conference on Corporate Citizenship in 1996; the White House Coffee guest list for March 6, 1996; the signing of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996; the signing for the Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997; and the signing for the Balanced Budget Act of 1997. These memoranda concern President Clinton's meeting with the AFL-CIO Executive Council, including Trumka, in 1995.
