The Basics

- Wiki- From the Hawaiian word for “fast”, a wiki is a website that is editable by anyone who can access it

- milWiki- a Knowledge Management tool used by the Army Knowledge Online (AKO) community behind the wall
 - 112,242 registered milWiki users
 - 13,666 milWiki articles

- Publishing (ATTP)-Army Tactics, Techniques and Procedures
 - A secure collaborative publishing site
 - Accelerate the sharing of knowledge compared to typical timeframes for staffing revisions to Field Manuals (FMs)



The Concept

- ❑ The Army has launched a test allowing Soldiers and leaders to make real time updates to the Army's Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (ATTP) via a wiki environment

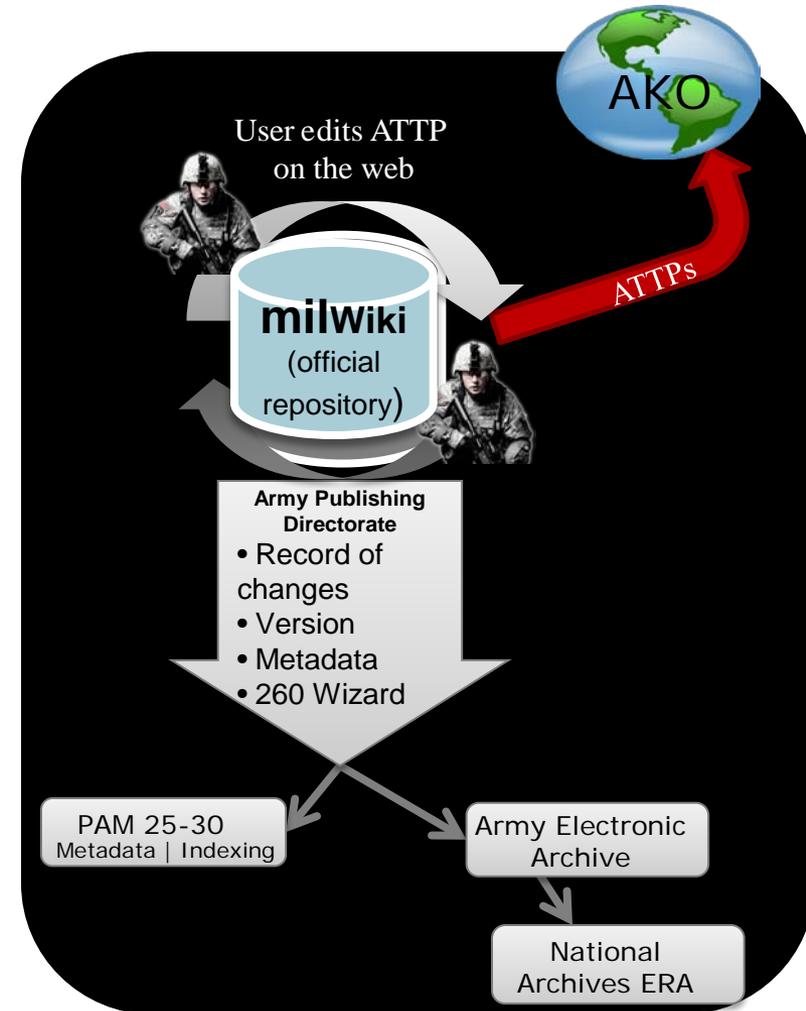
- ❑ The process under review shapes the future of the Army's learning processes that ultimately will be led by the "digital natives" in today's Army

- ❑ Two options were considered:
 - Option A- No proponent (process owner) adjudication
 - Option B- Changes are held and reviewed by the proponent



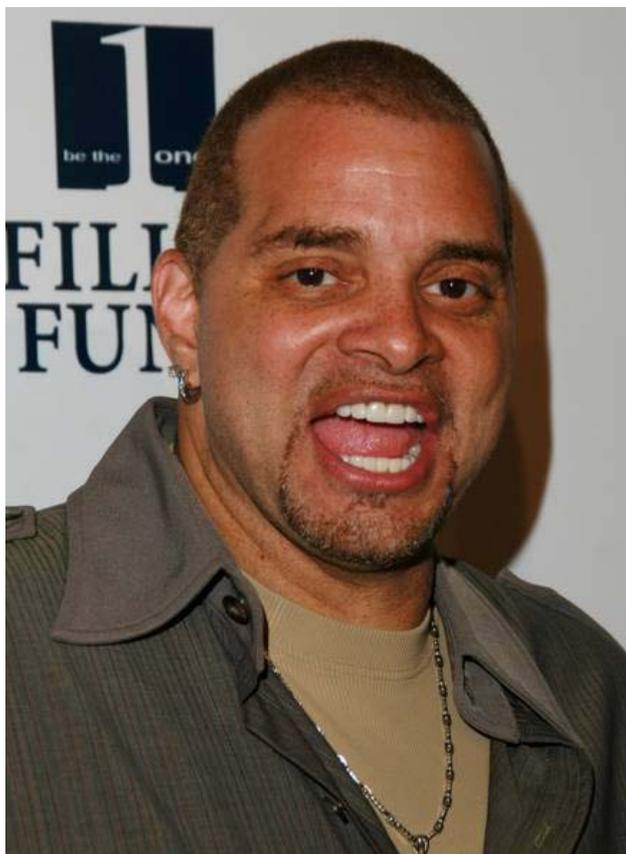
Option A

- ❑ No proponent adjudication.
- ❑ FMs are converted to ATTP then authenticated and loaded on milWiki
- ❑ AKO users are able to edit these ATTPs on the web

- ❑ What if this were doctrine on an M18A1 Claymore Anti-Personnel Mine?
- ❑ Army Doctrine is a Permanent Record.
 - Volume of changes
 - Metadata
- ❑ What affect will this have?
 - Storage Capacity?
 - Additional Costs anticipated?





Potential Solutions

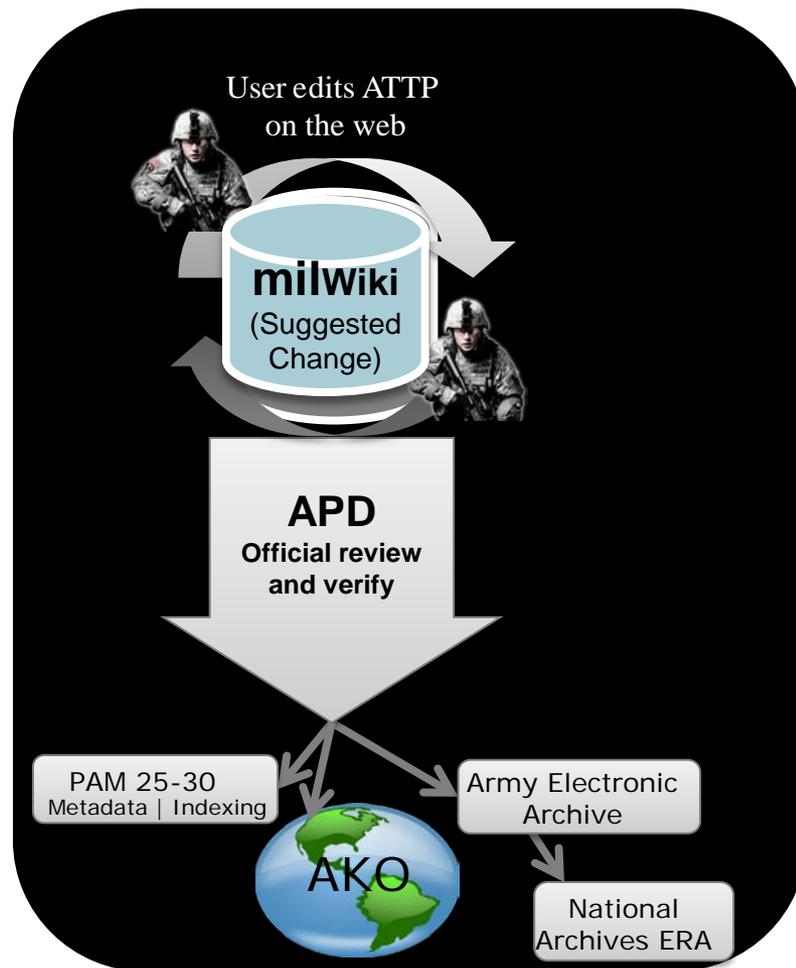
- NARA Representatives suggested pre-accession of ATTP records
 - This was the preferred method by the Working Group.
 - Issues with this solution

- Storage in Army Electronic Archive
 - This would require the development of a process with APD's Enterprise Content Management System (ECMS)
 - Issues with this solution



Option B

- milWiki sends data, metadata, and 260s to the ECMS APD database for authentication
- Once approved the information is then distributed appropriately





Option “B” in the current state

- ❑ The ATTPs on milWiki are in a draft form and not for implementation
- ❑ Army Doctrine Web on milWiki is a doctrine developmental tool only and is currently being tested
- ❑ Suggested changes to doctrine are to be reviewed by the proponent for authentication, then the normal doctrine development process is followed
