Documents are accumulated by the US Army Environmental Hygiene Agency (USEHA); the Army medical laboratories, Europe; the Army Pacific Environmental Health Engineering Agency, Japan; Preventative Medicine Activities of MEDCEN and MEDDAC; and Department of the Army and major command headquarters. Included are survey reports and similar or related documents. PROPOSED DISPOSITION: Destroy after 75 years. Retain 5 years in CFA. JUSTIFICATION: The retention timeframe has been extended to comply with Department of Defense Instruction 6055.5, para F6c(4); 29 CFR 1910.1001(i)(1); and CFR 1910.1025(n)(1). CFR 1019.1025(n)(1)(iii) requires that employers maintain exposure monitoring records for at least 40 years or for the duration of employment plus 20 years, whichever is longer.
