

The OCDETF program funds attorneys, agents, and support personnel from participating law enforcement agencies located throughout the country and OCDETF cases are initiated in all federal judicial districts. ## OCDETF Management Information System (MIS) – Law Enforcement Sensitive

### 1 Inputs: Paper copies dated 1982 - Present

*Temporary*: Cut off data at the close of case Destroy 5 years after cutoff, upon verification of successful conversion and input into the system

### 2. OCDETF MIS Data Files (Master File)

*PERMANENT* Cut off data for closed cases annually Transfer a copy of the data for closed cases to the National Archives and Records Administration 25 years after cutoff, in accordance with 36 CFR 1228.270, or existing NARA-transfer requirements at the time of transfer

### 3 Outputs

*Temporary*: Destroy/delete when no longer needed for administrative, legal, audit, or other purposes (GRS 20, Item 16)

### 4. System Documentation

*PERMANENT* Transfer to the National Archives and Records Administration with the permanent OCDETF (MIS) Data Files (GRS 20, Item 11(a)2)
